On day one we visited the beef and sheep research farms for Texas A&M University, learned how Texas A&M University is assisting pecan growers as they demonstrated pecan harvesting, tasted some delicious ice cream at Blue Bell Creamery, and got a demonstration of aerial pesticide application.

Day two included a visit to learn about livestock genetics at Transova, a tour of Producers Cooperative store, feed mill, and fertilizer, and a stop at the George Bush Presidential Library. The day concluded with a visit to downtown Bryan, Texas.

2024 Spokesperson for Agriculture Contest

2024 marks the 49th year for the Young Farmer Spokesperson for Agriculture Program. The objectives for the program are as follows:

- 1. To provide an educational program that inspires participation from the majority of the chapter belonging to the IYFA.
- 2. To enhance public speaking skills of all young men and women by encouraging competition.
- 3. To further educate the general public about issues facing agriculture in this nation and world.
- 4. To provide a rewarding and fun-filled experience where contestants will be excited about participation.

Contestant Eligibility:

Any active member of the Indiana Young Farmers' Association or any high school (9th-12th grade) FFA member may enter. Previous state winners must sit out two years.

Topic:

Spokespersons competing in the contest must present a prepared five minute statement on a current topic that will provide a positive perspective of agricultural and renewable resources to an audience of consumers and producers. A ten minute questioning period by the judges will follow.

Criteria for Selection:

In both the statement and the questioning period, evaluation will be based on how well the spokesperson considers a variety of view points, how accurate and convincing they are, and on the overall delivery of their presentation. Questions in the ten minute questioning period will be asked by the judges. Contestants are encouraged, but not required to use props, which may help get the point across in the five minute statement. Visual aids needing additional set up or equipment are not permitted.

Objectives:

- I. Provide an opportunity for both consumers and agriculturalists to better understand each other.
- 2. Promote agriculture and encourage more appreciation for the quality of food available in the United States.
- 3. Provide an opportunity for communication and interaction between consumers and agriculturalists.
- 4. Promote IYFA as a dynamic organization in the agricultural field.
- 5. Provide an educational opportunity for IFYA members to voice their pride and concerns for agriculture.
- 6. Enhance writing skills of participants while providing them an opportunity to voice their opinions on issues facing agriculture today.

Contestant eligibility:

Any member or high school (9th-12th grade) FFA member who has not won the past two years of the IYFA Essay Contest will be eligible to participate.

Topic: Any agriculture topic

Writers competing in the contest must submit a 500-1,000 word statement (essay), letter-to-the-editor of a local newspaper, or letter to an opinion setter (politician, chamber leader, etc.) on the above topic.

Scoring Criteria for Essay:

Content: Consideration of other's viewpoints (15), Accuracy and convincing (20), Readability (15), **Subtotal (50)**

Research: Evidence to support statement (10), Bibliography and footnotes (10), Subtotal (20)

Composition: Grammar (10), Format and originality (10), Writing skills (10), Subtotal (30)

Grand Total (100)

Penalty: Five (5) points will be deducted from the total score for each 25 words under 500 or over 1,000 in essay itself.

2024 Photo Contest

Contestant Eligibility: Any active member of the IYFA or high school (9th-12th grade) FFA member can venter. Past state winners of the Photo Contest are not eligible the year after they win. Individuals submitting photographs release copyright to the IYFA.

RULES:

- 1. Each member or advisor may submit one photo in each of the following categories:
 - Ag
 - Non-Ag
- 2. Entries are to be 5x7 mounted color print(s) (no frames).
- 3. All pictures must have title, which may be located on the front or back.
- 4. Turn in photos at convention registration by 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, February 24, 2024.
- 5. All entries must be identified on the back of the picture with name, chapter, home address, title of picture and category.
- 6. Must be original photographs taken by the person that has submitted the photo(s).
- 7. Entries may be picked up on Saturday evening, February 24, at headquarters.

TOPICS: Photographs competing in the contest must present a photograph of an agricultural, environmental, agribusiness, or rural life-style topic that will provide a positive perspective of agriculture/ renewable resources to an audience of consumers and producers.

WINNERS: You may only win in one category; a winner will be selected for each of the two categories and one selected for Best Overall Photo.

This year's Farm Business Management Contest will be similar to previous years. You will have one hour to complete the exam. Chapter advisors will not be permitted to participate, but are encouraged to work with chapter members to help prepare them for the contest.
